Subject: Fifth Annual Arctic Shipping Best Practice Information Forum (16 to 18 November 2021)

1 The Fifth Annual Arctic Shipping Best Practice Information Forum (the Forum) will be held virtually, due to the COVID-19 restrictions, from 16 to 18 November 2021.

2 Hosted by the Protection of the Arctic Marine Environment (PAME) Working Group of the Arctic Council, the meeting is supported by the Organization, which obtained observer status with the Arctic Council in May 2019.

3 The Organization has participated in the Forum since its inception and contributed to the Forum's Web Portal (www.arcticshippingforum.is), a publicly accessible website containing information specific to each chapter of the Polar Code and relevant to all those involved in safe and environmentally sound Arctic shipping, including, but not limited to, regulators, international organizations, shipowners/operators, regulators, classification societies/ recognized organizations, marine insurers, indigenous and local communities and other interested parties. A particular emphasis is placed on information used by shipowners and operators in developing Polar Water Operational Manuals, as required by the Polar Code.

4 Participation in the Forum is open to Arctic States, permanent participants and Arctic Council observers, as well as to any widely recognized professional organization dedicated to improving safe and environmentally sound marine operations in the Arctic as demonstrated by expertise and experience in Arctic shipping and/or related issues. The Forum also draws on experience from the Antarctic. The theme of this fifth annual Forum meeting is: **The Polar Code: Nearly Five Years On.**

5 PAME has extended the invitation to the Fifth Annual Arctic Shipping Best Practice Information Forum to interested IMO Member States and Associate Members, United Nations and specialized agencies, intergovernmental organizations and non-governmental organizations in consultative status and requests those wishing to participate to contact the PAME Secretariat via the registration (see paragraph 8).
