Arctic Council Protection of the Arctic Marine Environment (PAME) Working Group 4th Marine Protected Areas (MPA) Workshop 2018:

Exploring ways to support Indigenous involvement in, and Indigenous led, marine protection in the circumpolar Arctic Ocean

Workshop Description

Canada and the Inuit Circumpolar Council-Canada will co-host the next PAME MPA workshop in Cambridge Bay, Nunavut from Tuesday, November 27-Thursday, November 29. Workshop participants will seek to achieve the following objectives:

- Develop our understanding of the state of Indigenous involvement in and Indigenous led marine protection in the circumpolar Arctic Ocean
- Develop our understanding of 'Indigenous Knowledge' as a foundational element in MPA and MPA network design and management
- Identify ways to support a spectrum of Indigenous involvement in marine protection, including a community of best practice
- Identify potential next steps in advancing the understanding of Indigenous involvement in the identification, and management, of marine conservation areas.

The workshop will be organized around three themed sessions:

- <u>Session 1</u>: Indigenous involvement in MPA identification and design
- <u>Session 2</u>: Indigenous involvement in MPA management and monitoring
- <u>Session 3</u>: Indigenous governance models

Workshop organizers are still seeking proposals for presentations, particularly under Sessions 1 and 2. If you would like to present, or nominate someone to present, please submit your proposals to <u>Katharine.Ferri@dfo-mpo.gc.ca</u>.

Accommodation:

<u>Flights:</u>

The closest large international airport to Cambridge Bay (TCB) is the Edmonton International Airport (YEG).

We have obtained a group promotional code for flights between Edmonton and Cambridge Bay on <u>First Air</u> for a guaranteed price of \$1800.00 CAD all in/return¹

If you provide First Air with your connecting international or domestic flight information into and out of Edmonton, they will also ensure that your journey is connected all the way through.
