

Poland's Arctic policy goals

- 1) Active and responsible partner of the Arctic and advocate of the enhanced observer activity at the Arctic Council;
- 2) Greater domestic institutions' continuity and effectiveness in reference to the Arctic;
- 3) Secured continuity of scientific research; science-based policyand decision-making; science diplomacy;
- Region relevant economic cooperation between Polish and Arctic enterprises;
- 5) Cooperation and partner relations with social actors in the Arctic, in particular with indigenous peoples organizations;
- 6) Effectively influencing Arctic related activities of the EU and other international organizations.



- FPSO for "Johan Castberg" field on the Barents Sea
- LNG and dual fuel propulsion

- Polar policy with more specific maritime component and an action plan
- Actively follows relevant PAME activities and identifies possible involvement/ contribution opportunities once PPP is adopted
- Poland supports the Arctic States in their efforts to protect Arctic marine environment
- Support at other international organisations HELCOM, EU, IALA, IHO, ILO, IMO
